

The unit deals with the census and cataloguing of the existing translations of Maximus the Greek's works in Church Slavonic and the bibliographic research and the preparation of materials for the creation of the lemmary section on the website. Grant #8: PRIN 2022 - Biomedical discourse and communication in multicultural societies (University of Milan La Statale; University of Bergamo; «G. d'Annunzio» University of Chieti-Pescara) - DISBIOCOM - grant number 20227FWEZ5: The project deals with biomedical discourse, with special reference to the COVID-19 pandemic, with a focus on vaccination campaigns and the emergence of new diseases (e.g. long covid) or prolonged consequences of the disease (e.g. mental illness) in the 2020-23 timeframe. The main object of study is the communication of the set of information, recommendations and technical guidelines relating to the pandemic, issued by the institutions responsible for the protection of public health (at national, regional and local level) and by media, as well as the reception and processing of such information flow by citizens in Italy and Spain, including migrant communities. Considering that those varieties are a testbed for theories and models of Contact Linguistics, the focus will be on both synchronic variation and diachronic change.
